#### Two Kinds of Sadness

We have arrived at the holy and beautiful period of the Lenten fast! Many of us think of this as a joyous time of year, when the Church gives so much to look forward to, the services, the time leading us to the great feast of Pascha. But when we read works by the saints and Church fathers about Lent, it is not uncommon to hear about <a href="repentance">repentance</a> and <a href="sadness">sadness</a>. As a matter of fact, they bid us embrace sadness. Why is this? Aren't we Christians so that we could be happy all the time? Let's look at this today.

There are two kinds of sadness: holy sadness and earthly sadness. They stand as far apart from one another as two attitudes possibly can. They are opposites - but we may miss this point because they both make us feel sad. A second name for holy sadness is <u>repentance</u>, and a second name for earthly sadness is <u>depression</u>.

St. Paul draws the distinction best in his second letter to the Corinthians (7:10): For godly sorrow produces repentance leading to salvation, not to be regretted; but the sorrow of the world produces death. The first thing I want to say is: part of this translation (I took this directly from the Orthodox Study Bible, but it's the case with most English translations) is <u>bad</u>. It says in English that God's sorrow produces repentance, and the world's sorrow produces death. So - the word "produces," which occurs twice, are also identical in the original Greek? No, not at all!

Let's look at the passage. For godly sorrow (that part is fine, but I'll switch to the Greek) μετάνοιαν εἰς σωτηρίαν ἀμεταμέλητον ἐργάζεται. I would translate this as: works a remorseless repentance leading to salvation. Focus on the verb "works." "Produces" is not what this says. The word in Greek ἐργάζεται has an element of effort in it: repentance does not just happen to us (as we might infer from "produces"), but we work it, we participate in it's development within us.

The next part says: but the sorrow of the world produces death. In this phrase, the word "produces" is κατεργάζεται - a similar but different word from ἐργάζεται! - which does indeed mean "produce, bring about, cause." This word has an element of passivity. I can catch a virus that <u>produces</u> or causes illness in me, but I haven't done anything to get it and I do nothing to keep it. This describes the illness of depression, which can creep into our lives without our knowledge or desire to have it.

We do indeed search for and nourish sadness during Lent, but it's a sadness that has several important characteristics: 1) is it godly, 2) there is no remorse, 3) it leads to salvation, and most importantly, 4) we <u>cause</u> it to happen. We welcome it. We use it, we thank God for it.

My beloved brothers and sisters, Καλή Σαρακοστή και καλή δύναμη! A good Lent to you and good strength!






# TUESDAY, MARCH 25 FLAG RAISING AT CITY HALL



#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Parish,

You are sitting in your doctor's office fooling with your phone when the door opens and your doctor comes in. She is not smiling. "I have the results of your tests and, to coin a phrase, "I have bad news and good news."

"Bad news" you say "but also good news".

"The bad news is really bad but there is a way out and it will work." She goes on to explain that you have a rare disease that can be overcome if you completely change your lifestyle. You have to throw away your life as you now live it, become self disciplined, deny yourself those behaviors that will make your disease worse, and you will live a long and fruitful life.

"Now if you really believe in me, in my diagnosis, you will try very hard to follow my instructions. I am afraid that if you do not, your life will get very ugly."

She explains the changes you must make and they will not be easy. While you might be very self indulgent you are not a fool. You listen carefully to her, you change your mind about how you will live your life, and you are grateful to her when she says "Call me whenever you are losing your new resolve."

You changed your mind. You turned it around. You might say that you experienced METANOIA, which we also translate as REPENTENCE. Jesus says (in all four of the Gospels), "Whoever shall seek to keep his life shall lose it; and whosoever shall lose his life shall preserve it." You will throw off the old and take on the new. You will lose the old and preserve the new.

Who is the old person? Perhaps one who is angry, who cannot forgive. Perhaps the one who is full of pride and arrogance. Perhaps the one who eats and drinks to excess? Perhaps the one who lacks charity. And on and on.

Socrates said "The unexamined life is not worth living." The New Testament says, the unrepentant life leads to ultimate disaster. When you believe in the doctor, you do what she says. We go to church and we believe that we believe in the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. But do we take to heart the words of the Lord's prayer, "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." If we really believe then we must try so hard to do God's will. And when we fail, when we lapse, when we fall down as we surely do, we must get up and resume the struggle.

Lent, the challenge and the opportunity is upon us. Lent, a special time to look inward and to honestly assess our transgressions. Lose your life, throw off the old person and take on the new. That this would be easy the Lord never said. Thanks be to God.

Thanks also to God and those parishioners who donated to our new sound system. We can now clearly hear the words of the priest and the chanters no matter where in the pews we sit. When the words are clear and crisp our brains do not have to strain to figure out exactly what is being said. When the words are clear, you can concentrate on the whole experience. You participate in the lyrics, the music, the message in a way that is complete and meaningful. I should add that live streaming has also significantly improved. All good things come from God. Thanks be to Him who has provided us with generous parishioners who quickly offered to fund this wonderful improvement to our services.

To all, have a wonderful Lenten experience.

#### =>Super Plus Coffee Service - \$150 includes the following:


Philoptochos provides and serves the Pastries, coffee, milk, sugar, and juice.




